



- Maintained by WCO through the HS Committee by the Nomenclature Sub-Directorate.

ARTICLE 3

Obligations of Contracting Parties

- Subject to the exceptions enumerated in Article 4 :
 - (a) Each Contracting Party undertakes, except as provided in subparagraph (c) of this paragraph, that from the date on which this Convention enters into force in respect of it, its Customs tariff and statistical nomenclatures shall be in conformity with the Harmonized System. It thus undertakes that, in respect of its Customs tariff and statistical nomenclatures:
 - it shall use all the headings and subheadings of the Harmonized System without addition or modification, together with their related numerical codes;
 - (ii) it shall apply the General Rules for the interpretation of the Harmonized System and all the Section, Chapter and Subheading Notes, and shall not modify the scope of the Sections, Chapters, headings or subheadings of the Harmonized System; and
 - (iii) it shall follow the numerical sequence of the Harmonized System;
 - (b) Each Contracting Party shall also make publicly available its import and export trade statistics in conformity with the six-digit codes of the Harmonized System, or, on the initiative of the Contracting Party, beyond that level, to the extent that publication is not precluded for exceptional reasons such as commercial confidentiality or national security;

ARTICLE 16

Amendment procedure

- 1. The Council may recommend amendments to this Convention to the Contracting Parties.
- Any Contracting Party may notify the Secretary General of an objection to a recommended amendment and may subsequently withdraw such objection within the period specified in paragraph 3 of this Article.
- Any recommended amendment shall be deemed to be accepted six months after the date of its notification by the Secretary General provided that there is no objection outstanding at the end of this period.
- 4. Accepted amendments shall enter into force for all Contracting Parties on one of the following dates :
 - (a) where the recommended amendment is notified before 1 April, the date shall be the first of January of the second year following the date of such notification,

or

- (b) where the recommended amendment is notified on or after 1 April, the date shall be the first of January of the third year following the date of such notification.
- 5. The statistical nomenclatures of each Contracting Party and its Customs tariff nomenclature or, in the case provided for under paragraph 1 (c) of Article 3, its combined tariff/statistical nomenclature, shall be brought into conformity with the amended Harmonized System on the date specified in paragraph 4 of this Article.
- 6. Any State or Customs or Economic Union signing without reservation of ratification, ratifying or acceding to this Convention shall be deemed to have accepted any amendments thereto which, at the date when it becomes a Contracting Party, have entered into force or have been accepted under the provisions of paragraph 3 of this Article.



HS 2012 Amendments-SIMPLIFICATION

Each review cycle has seen attempt to keep the HS up to date by eliminating item with trade below a threshold agreed to by the Committee. The threshold currently stands at \$50 million for 6-digit subheadings and \$100 million for 4 digit headings

The Harmonized System 2012 UPDATING THE HS

- To keep the system current with modern trading practices, product development and the needs of users:
 - Harmonized System Committee
 - Review Sub-Committee
 - Scientific Sub-Committee



Harmonized System Committee (HSC)

- Composed of the representatives of HS
 Contracting Parties to the Convention (1 vote each)
- Members of the Council which are not Contracting Parties and representatives of International Organizations may attend the HSC as observers
- Normally two sessions in a year



Harmonized System Committee (HSC)

Dealing with:

- Legal Text amendments
- Classification questions
- Explanatory Note amendments
- HS-related Council recommendations
- General questions and policy matters relating to the HS



Harmonized System Committee (HSC)

- Amendments to the HS shall be taken by a majority of not less than two-thirds of the votes cast by the Members of the Committee
- Each Session of the HSC can adopt modifications to the HS. The last Committee before the end of the review cycle has to vote again all the modifications.



Harmonized System Review Sub- Committee (RSC)

FUNCTIONS:

- It shall normally hold two sessions per year; Same composition as the HSC
- Function: To pursue a review of the HS and to propose to the Committee such amendments, considering the needs of users and to changes in technology or in patterns of international trade;

UPDATING THE HS

Scientific Sub- Committee (SSC)

- It shall normally hold at least one session a year;
 Each Contracting Party shall have the right to be represented
- The SSC shall be an advisory body of the Council on questions involving chemical or other scientific matters. It shall seek to reach agreed views although the differing views should also be reported to the Council or Committee

The Harmonized System 2012 UPDATING THE HS: The Drafting period

The process normally starts with contact between the international trade community and the government agencies charged with determining trade policy in Member administrations.

Proposals are also received from International Organizations (e.g., UN)

At the end of the review period the aggregated amendments are presented to the WCO Council for approval.



- Any Contracting Party may notify the Secretary General of an objection to a recommended amendment and may subsequently withdraw such objection within the period specified in paragraph 3 of this Article.
- Any recommended amendment shall be deemed to be accepted six months after the date of its notification by the Secretary General provided that there is no objection outstanding at the end of this period.
- 4. Accepted amendments shall enter into force for all Contracting Parties on one of the following dates :
 - (a) where the recommended amendment is notified before 1 April, the date shall be the first of January of the second year following the date of such notification,

or

- (b) where the recommended amendment is notified on or after 1 April, the date shall be the first of January of the third year following the date of such notification.
- 5. The statistical nomenclatures of each Contracting Party and its Customs tariff nomenclature or, in the case provided for under paragraph 1 (c) of Article 3, its combined tariff/statistical nomenclature, shall be brought into conformity with the amended Harmonized System on the date specified in paragraph 4 of this Article.
- 6. Any State or Customs or Economic Union signing without reservation of ratification, ratifying or acceding to this Convention shall be deemed to have accepted any amendments thereto which, at the date when it becomes a Contracting Party, have entered into force or have been accepted under the provisions of paragraph 3 of this Article.

The HS Convention provides for what is, in effect, a two and one-half year implementation period for amendments to the Harmonized System. At first sight this appears to be an extraordinarily long period of time but one-half year is allotted for the entry of reservations by Contracting Parties to the amending recommendation

The remaining two years are set aside for:

- Updating and re-publication of all HS publications (Nomenclature, Explanatory Notes, Classification Opinions, Alphabetical Index, Correlation Tables, Commodity Database, etc)
- Updating of the WCO Web site
- Translation of the texts into third languages
- Legislative process and miscellaneous updates in Member administrations
- Training of Customs, other affected government agencies and the trade.
- Other international institutions can be affected (UN statics, WTO negotiations..)



The Harmonized System 2012 UPDATING THE HS: The analysis period

The proposal is forwarded to the WCO and considered by the (RSC). If the proposal is a simple one, the Sub-Committee may accept it upon its first review. More commonly, however, proposals are subjected to an initial review by the Sub-Committee and held over for further consideration at a subsequent meeting to resolve questions.

In April 2006, the Secretariat received a proposal from Brazil for the amendment of the Nomenclature to provide for BIODIESEL

The Review Sub-Committee (RSC) at its 34th, 35th and 36th Sessions (October 2006, April 2007, November 2007) discussed possible amendments of the Nomenclature to provide for BIODIESEL.

In April 2008, the Secretariat received an alternative proposal from Japan regarding the amendments of the Nomenclature to provide for BIODIESEL

The Review Sub-Committee (RSC) at its 37th Session (April 2008) discussed possible amendments of the Nomenclature to provide for BIODIESEL.



The Harmonized System 2012 UPDATING THE HS: Biodiesel as example

The RSC, at its 38th Session (November 2008), felt that it needed the advice of the Scientific Sub-Committee (SSC) regarding the concept "long chain fatty acids" to be inserted in a possible amendment of the Nomenclature to provide for BIODIESEL

The SSC, at its 24th Session (January 2009) discussed the technical question asked by the RSC and offered its advice on the matter.

The Harmonized System Committee, at its 43rd Session (March 2009) adopted the amendments of the Nomenclature to provide for BIODIESEL on the basis of the comments by the RSC and the SSC.

In June 2009, the Council adopted the amendments to the Nomenclature (including the BIODIESEL)





HS 2017 Amendments

Amendments to the Nomenclature (Request by the Organization for the Prohibition of Chemical Weapons, OPCW)

On 23 April 2010, the OPCW formally requested that subheadings for the 33 (thirty-three) most traded scheduled chemicals be included in the 2017 amendments to the Harmonized System (HS).

Effective controls and the ability to monitor transfers in scheduled chemicals can only be achieved if scheduled chemicals being traded are identified by Customs.






