Biological Arms Control Use of Harmonized System (1)

HS basis for:

- Customs tariffs
- Trade statistics
- Rules of origin
- Internal taxes

Biological Arms Control Use of Harmonized System (2)

- Trade negotiations
- Transport tariffs
- Monitoring of controlled goods
- Customs process areas of Customs controls

- General Interpretative Rules
- Each product a single classification
- Preliminary provisions
- Hierarchical fashion
- Applicable throughout nomenclature

Biological Arms Control Identification

- First step: ---->identification and description in HS terms
- Classification as presented
- Objective criteria

- Collection of trade data
- Monitoring of controlled goods

- Amending the HS
- Recommendation to introduce additional subdivisions in national statistical nomenclature

Amending the HS

- Long procedure
- All Contracting Parties should accept
- Obligation to introduce amendments

Biological Arms Control Council Recommendation (1)

- Description of products
- HS codes
- National legislation

Biological Arms Control Council Recommendation (2)

- Relatively short procedure
- No obligation to implement
- No uniformity worldwide

Biological Arms Control Conclusions

- HS is most appropriate instrument
- World-wide uniform application
- Identification
- HS amendment
- WCO Recommendation
